# **SPOC Update**

The June 19, 2017 delivery of the DRAFT State Plan (Plan) began a 45-day Plan review period. Public safety stakeholders and State authorities have been reviewing the Plan to ensure the network build-out meets the unique needs of Louisiana first responders and our public safety community.

The initial 45-day review period is followed by another 45-day period for FirstNet to review comments provided by the State.

# Stakeholder Input

During the initial review period, we have been meeting with FirstNet, AT&T, our technical consultants, staff, first responders and other Louisiana public safety stakeholders to discuss the Plan and collect comments.

Louisiana FirstNet, in partnership with FirstNet and AT&T, is hosting a series of Louisiana Regional Meetings. #### Louisiana Has A Decision To Make

All 56 States and Territories must have a radio access network (RAN) to connect to the FirstNet network. States have an option as to who is responsible to deploy, operate and maintain their RAN.

- States can opt-in to the FirstNet + AT&T partnership, in which case the partnership will be responsible to deploy, operate and maintain the State's RAN at NO cost to the State for the partnership's 25-year contract period; OR
- States can opt-out, in which case the State is responsible to deploy, operate and maintain its RAN, including costs and risks.

The Governor has 90 days to make the opt-in/opt-out decision.


#### The Plan Articulates 16 Key Solutions That Improve The Public Safety **Communications Platform**

- Access to existing AT&T in-building assets.
- Access to new and existing AT&T deployables.
- Network-friendly and bring-your-own devices (BYODs).
- Basic and future services, including voice, data, messaging and mission-critical services.
- Priority (preferred access) / preemption (terminates or relocates other users without priority).
- Cybersecurity assets.
- Single sign-on Identity Credential and Access Management (ICAM) capability.
- FirstNet App Store.
- Unprecedented visibility into network status through a specially created Public Safety Home Page.

- App Developer Program.
- Solutions, including BYODs for Push-to-Talk (PTT), mobile virtual private network (VPN), messaging and location based services (LBS).
- Public safety solution specialists to educate agencies on how to best use FirstNet services (training).
- U.S. based dedicated 24/7/365 support.
- Competitive rate and service plans, and procurement and contracting vehicles.
- Local control to manage rate plans, priority levels, PTT groups and ICAM authorizations.
- Coverage.

The Plan also defines Primary, Extended Primary and Primary/Extended Primary users that pay personally for service; provides a phased approach to deployment; includes an Acceptance Guide for States that opt-in; and articulates requirements for building an alternative plan for States that opt-out.
